Who is God? Who is not? Who are the REAL American idols?

What was required to live faithfully in the days of the Roman Empire? What is required for us to live faithfully in the world's first borderless empire?

Such questions are at the heart of the Book of Revelation – a book seldom read yet the source of numerous beloved hymns, a book often misunderstood but full of truth worthy of our trust.

In response to a request from the Board of Religious Education, we will be offering a five-week adult Bible study on Wednesday afternoons, 2:00-3:30 pm, from April 11 through May 9.

While this bible study will present an overview of the Revelation to St. John, it will focus primarily on chapters 1-3 (where there are individual letters to the seven congregations to which John was writing) and chapter 18 (where there is a description of the empire's fall).

We will read a brief book – *No Longer at Ease: Seven Churches and the Empire* -- which I wrote and used as one of the textbooks when teaching a seminary course on this subject. I know some of you already purchased the book when it was made available in Dutton Hall one Sunday morning last Fall.

If you do not have a copy yet and want to join this class, please let Liz or me know by March 15th, so that we can secure more copies. My home supply has been exhausted, but I can secure more and make them available to you for a discounted price of \$10/each.

Please, please, please do not let either the subject matter or my book scare you away. We shall begin with the assumption that you have no knowledge of Revelation at all. (No insult intended. It's just a simple reality that most folk know little about the last biblical book.) And my book was written for local church audiences.



March Love Offering: One Great Hour of Sharing



Community Health Network has been conducting heart health classes and blood pressure clinics throughout the month of Heart Health February. THE FEDERATED CHURCH TREASURER'S REPORT January 31, 2018

This report covers only those funds available for paying operating expenses and does not include bequests, designated pass through funds, or unrealized gains from investments.

The operating income for January was \$26,206 and the month's operating expenses were \$13,088. This means that we had \$13,118 more income than expense. We did \$837 better than anticipated. The year is too new to draw any trends or conclusions. It does reflect that 2018 is stepping off well.
