Thoughts and Prayers

Throughout this past month, ever since the school shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland FL, people have taken to Facebook and Twitter saying "Enough with your thoughts and prayers, silent moments and condolences."

The message: pious platitudes won't cut it anymore -- the time for too-long-delayed action is now.

I confess to finding that message disturbing. It got under my skin and irritatingly stayed there. When something bothers me that much, typically it means I need to stop and think it through.

I believe in sending thoughts and prayers. I believe in it because there have been times in my own life when I have felt supported and uplifted by others sending their thoughts and prayers to me. I believe in it because I have seen prayers answered in miraculous ways. I believe in it because keeping someone in my thoughts increases my awareness and intensifies my caring.

Sometimes I have sent thoughts and prayers because I didn't know any other way to respond. More often than not, once having sent my thoughts and prayers, I discover something that would be helpful to do.

At the same time, I understand the sentiment of those now saying "enough." I understand because Christianity is an action-oriented faith. We are called to be "doers of the word, and not merely hearers," as St. James teaches, before going on to make us uncomfortable by asking, "If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill,' and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what good is that?"

Today, James might ask "What good is it be say to students 'be safe,' if you do not also pass laws to increase their safety in school?"

There is an old German proverb which encourages us to "Pray as if working would do any good. Work as if prayers won't be answered." Finally, it doesn't boil down to our *either* offering thoughts and prayers *or* our taking action. We are called as Christians to do both.

THE FEDERATED CHURCH TREASURER'S REPORT February 28, 2018

This report covers only those funds available for paying operating expenses and does not include bequests, designated pass through funds, or unrealized gains from investments.

The operating income for February was \$10,722 and the month's operating expenses were 13,543. This means that we had \$2,821 more expense than income.

The year to date operating statement income was \$36,979 and the operating expense was \$33,036. This means we have \$3,942 more income than expense.

Notes:

During the month of February the church received \$25,500 in bequests from the Virginia and Arnie Larson Estate and the Don Blickem Family. The council voted to place these undesignated funds into the Roof Replacement Account.

The Trustees received the \$5,250 bill for repairing the damage to the air conditioner lightning strike last summer. They had received a \$4,300 insurance payment in 2017. This cash flow difference distorts the budget report

Reminder: If you designate a portion of the Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA to be deposited directly to the church bank account, you do not have to pay income tax on that portion.

In summary, the general contributions should be caught up, the expense (after adjusting for the repair bill noted above) is less than expected. The detailed operating cash flow is shown below.


