

The palms from last year's Palm Sunday service have been kept for recycling until now. They are all dried up, of course. In a few days I will be setting them ablaze, gathering up the ashes, and adding a touch of oil, for use in our Ash Wednesday service on March 6th.

Early that evening, we will gather in Dutton Hall for a light supper prepared by our Deacons. Ashes, for those who wish to receive them, will be imposed, either on your forehead or hand. A visible cross will be drawn with the ashes. Then we will celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

The ancient tradition of saying "Remember thou art dust, and to dust thou shalt return" dates to the late 6th century and Pope Gregory the Great (540-604). That biblical line, Genesis 3:19, recalls the judgment given to Adam and Eve. It enjoins us to recognize that we, too, stand in need of God's grace

In 1969, post Vatican II, the wording was changed to "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1:15). These are the first words Jesus spoke according to the earliest written account of his life and ministry. They are the words we will be using.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent—a rather somber season of prayer, fasting, and repentance. The word "Alleluia" will disappear completely from our vocabulary until we sing it with great joy on Easter morning.

In preparation for that celebratory moment, we start our Lenten journey with this brief but moving service on Ash Wednesday, so that you can begin your spiritual preparation.




