As we enter the hazy lazy "dog days" of August, is there anything coming up on the docket?

Meg and I will be gone the first two Sundays in August, off on a long-planned vacation trip to Alaska, crossing one more off our bucket list. We appreciate and thank Bill Griesenauer for preaching the first Sunday, and Jerry Lane the second. Know that our being on vacation doesn't mean you can! Be assured, the church doors will be open for you to worship God in my absence.

Upon returning, we will be preparing for the fall stewardship campaign. This year's theme is "The Way" – which, by the way, is what Christianity was called in its earliest centuries. Christians were simply "followers of the way." The materials we will be using have been "written around an understanding of our faith as a way and stewardship as our caretaking of that way." We will need folks to help plan and lead the stewardship drive.

The Church Council will be calling a congregational meeting in early September to report where we stand year -to-date financially (anticipate a "smiley face); to ask for a budget adjustment for the remainder of the year in the line items for pastoral leadership (no surprise here either, for we planned all along to meet any extra expenses incurred with finding, moving, and enjoying fulltime leadership with a draw from last year's unexpended funds budgeted for the search); and to present a series of amendments we do not believe to be particularly controversial simply to update the constitution.

Beyond the budget, we do need to finish paying for the new sound system with second-mile giving. You were so generous earlier in meeting the first payment. Now we need to dip into pockets for the last payment of just over \$4000. Meg and I will contribute another \$400, putting our extra check in the offering plate, marked in the memo for "Sound System." Wouldn't it be wonderful to have this project completely done and paid for before I finish my ministry here?

I will be preaching up to and including September 15th, with Rev. Ogi beginning full time the next day. His first Sunday in the pulpit will be September 22nd – which we also will celebrate as Rally Day – and there will be a big welcoming reception following worship then. Our understanding is that the moving van is in route even now and one car already has arrived. How exciting!

The Mission of Voluntary Action Center is committed to providing high quality services that address the basic transportation and nutrition needs of its community. VAC was incorporated in 1974. The organization is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors comprised of representatives from communities throughout DeKalb County.

Voluntary Action Center is here to support the needs of the members of DeKalb, LaSalle, Putnam, Bureau and Kendall Counties. Over the years those needs have grown exponentially. At VAC it is our goal to ensure the health and wellness of those who need us. Our services include:
