



And the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision: "Do not be afraid, Abram, for I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless...?"...But the word of the Lord came to him: "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then God said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And Abram believed the Lord; and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness. --Genesis 15:1-6

As I begin my ministry with you, I have been thinking a lot about Abram and Sarai. You might know them better as Abraham and Sarah--the patriarch and matriarch not only of Christianity, but also of Judaism and Islam. Their names are changed later in the story when God finally fulfills God's promise of giving them a child--at 100 years old!

In short, the Abram-Abraham and Sarai-Sarah saga is a powerful story about the kind of God that we worship and follow, and the kind of faith we are invited to model in our own lives.

Abram and Sarai receive a challenging call to uproot themselves and journey into an unknown future where God promises to bless them in the most unlikely way: at 100 years old, they shall bear a child through whom the whole world will be blessed. This was no less absurd in their day as it is in ours. But God calls us into just such absurdities.

As you'll quickly see in this month's newsletter, October is full of opportunities to journey together into the future toward which God is calling us. While many of these events have been staples of our community for years, I invite you to consider what "absurd" new opportunity God might be calling you to in and through them. Is it to buy or deliver a pork dinner--or two or three--to someone who can't get out or who can't afford one? Or perhaps it is to buy a dinner to eat with a family member or friend with whom you've stopped talking? Is it to volunteer in new ways?

I invite you into the imagining--the possibilities are limitless. And so is *our* future as Federated Church--if we are willing to go above and beyond, following God into the absurdities where God promises we will find our true purpose: blessing the world in deep and transforming ways. When we do, we will discover that it is precisely these actions that most bless us in deep and transforming ways.



## Sondra King Memorial CROP Hunger Walk

The DeKalb County North (Sondra King Memorial) CROP Hunger Walk is on October 6 starting at 1 pm from the DeKalb United Methodist Church.

Thank you to all who donated and walked.

Church World Service is the organization which originated the CROP Hunger Walks almost 35 years ago. DeKalb County has been involved ever since that time. Nationally, in 2017, there were 900 walks with 107,000 participants raising \$9,000,000. Before the walks, though, grain was harvested and gleaned and shipped overseas to areas of the world which were war-torn or where need for food was dire. We continue that honorable tradition every year through our participation in the CROP Hunger Walk.

Brief facts about hunger:

795 million people around the world do not have enough food to lead a healthy, active life 1 out of 6 children – roughly 100 million – in developing countries is underweight Around the world, hunger kills more people than AIDS, malaria and tuberculosis combined Hunger is on the rise

Locally, the agencies which serve people in need and which provide food (such as Hope Haven, Safe Passage, and VAC-Meals on Wheels) are always in great need (25% of the funds we raise are used to support these agencies as well as Barb Food Mart, Bethlehem Food Pantry, and the Sycamore Food Pantry).
