From the Pastor's Desk

I have a confession: Lent is my favorite liturgical season.

I know pastors perhaps are not supposed to have favorites, but we're human just like everyone else! I also know I might be the odd one out in my love of lent.

Unfortunately, I think the ambiguity toward Lent for many comes from its mixed-up association with scarcity: fast. abstain from things you love. give something up. go without. do penitence. confess how bad you are. remember that you are dust.

There's a certain austerity—a shrewd simplicity—to the season, to be sure, but Lent isn't about self-flagellation or about God delighting in our abstinence from things we love.

Rather, for our fast-food, "super-size it" culture, it is a reminder that more isn't always better. In fact, "more" quite often gets in the way of "the better." Some people think about Lent as a time of personal and spiritual "spring cleaning;" a season of sustained self-reflection on what is cluttering up our lives, of what is getting in the way of "more life."

Lent is not about scarcity; it's about preparing for more, preparing for the new life awaiting us on the other side of the empty tomb.

In this sense, our Lenten journey embraces the truth at the heart of wisdom traditions throughout the world, including nature: life comes from death. Or, to put it another way, something *must* "die" in order for something new to spring forth. Like plant waste turning to compost and fertilizing this spring's new garden, what needs to be "cleaned out" or "die" in order for you to experience more of the true life, the blooming and flourishing, that God desires for you? Is it shame and self-blame? Is it pride and selfishness? Is it always having to be right or picking a fight? We must also ask the same question of ourselves as a church and society.

This death isn't easy and it can be quite painful, but it is necessary. The sad truth is that we are all addicted to many patterns and habits that bring more death rather than more life. But there is no shortcut to re-newed life or deeper living; the only way out is through. As the old folk song and spiritual reminds us: "Nobody else can walk [this Lenten journey] for us—we have to walk it by ourselves." But, while each of us must walk it for ourselves, we do not walk it alone. There is One who goes before us and journeys alongside us through it all; and we, too, will make it together as a church.

I hope you'll join us on the journey when you can—whether for worship on Sunday or during Holy Week, or for our Lenten Book Read group, which will reflect on this journey more deeply on Tuesday afternoons from 1-2pm.

One Great Hour of Sharing Love Offering "Investing in Futures"

The theme of the One Great Hour of Sharing Love Offering is "Investing in Futures." One Great Hour of Sharing® is one of four special mission offerings of the United Church of Christ. This Lenten Offering supports the disaster, refugee, and development ministries of the UCC. This March our church will be supporting these ministries by participating in the OGHS Sharing Calendar activity.

To participate in this mission offering, each of you will receive a <u>OGHS Sharing Calendar</u> *Investing in Futures* and <u>a special coin box</u> on Sunday, March 1. This calendar is designed to help us acknowledge our blessings but to also think about and pray for others. Each day highlights various situations and suggests a donation of coins or bills (units). Your household will decide which unit works best for you. It is easiest if you select one unit and use it throughout the days on the calendar. For example: A unit could be dimes, quarters, or dollar bills.

Use the Sharing Calendar as a daily giving devotion. The calendar not only gives us a chance to gather funds, but it also gives us a focused time of thinking about people and communities in a variety of ways that our gifts will help. This year we will focus on the love of children, neighbor, and creation, and how our donations are an investment into brighter futures.

Pray for the people and situations highlighted in the sharing calendar, and for the people you will meet every day. Trust that our giving, and sharing, and praying can mean a world of difference for people and communities in the midst of a crisis. God uses us and our gifts in ways beyond our imaginations.

The Board of Mission and Society hopes that you enjoy this enlightening activity and learn from it. We will be returning our boxes to church on <u>March 22, 2020.</u>






